A Message from the Principal

Happy New Year Raiders,

Summer has come and gone. Can you believe it? We have already begun a new year of teaching, learning, and growing. This new year has brought lots of newness to Warwick High School. We have three new administrators: Mrs. Natia Smith, our 10th Grade Administrator; Mr. Keith Kuberek, our 11th & 12th Grade Administrator; and Mrs. Micah Smith, our Assistant Principal of Instruction. Each brings with him/her a wealth of experiences and a passion for young people. We also have new teachers to our school, new science classrooms, and a brand new cafeteria. We are very excited.

Let me provide you with a review of the way in which we ended our academic year. While the state's scores for English declined, Warwick's English score neither declined nor increased. This year, we have implemented a Writing Across the Curricula Approach that should serve to increase students' writing skills. Across the state and here at Warwick, there was a decline in History scores. We have identified the categories that need the most attention, and we have implemented those strategies in the new history lessons. The Math department made great gains this year with an 8% increase in scores. Likewise, the Science department soared to an increase of 10% from last year. We commend both the Math and Science teachers and students for all their hard work, and we intend to continue along the path of success in those content areas. As you can guess, we are not satisfied. We will continue to research best practices and to implement improvement strategies that will serve to build upon what we have achieved thus far.

Well, the first week of school went very smoothly. The administrators, teachers, and counselors worked very hard to place students in the classes that will challenge them and

afford them the opportunity to excel. This year, our slogan is **(E³) Education x Engagement = Excellence**. We work extremely hard in the area of education. However, this year, we endeavor to do even more. Our added focus this year is that of engagement. We want students to feel as though they are an integral part of their school community. Thus, we must rely on the assistance of every family member. Help us by continuing to support students with their academics. Students need the support of their school and home communities to do well academically. Help us by encouraging students to attend school each day. As long as they are in school, we can help them to realize their dreams. Help us by encouraging students to bring with them a positive attitude. With a positive attitude, the most insurmountable obstacle can be obliterated.

We need the help of all our families and of as many of our community members as we can muster. For the past two years, we have bonded. Now, we must band together and literally do what it takes to see our students through some of the most important years of their lives. We do not take this immense

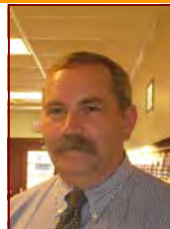

Dear Raider Family,

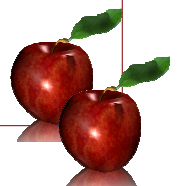

Counseling Notes

WELCOME BACK!!!

The goal of the School Counseling Department is to prepare our students to become productive 21st century learners and citizens by providing readiness skills which will be a valuable tool in preparing for college and/ or the world of work. In order for this to be accomplished, counselors will meet with all students throughout the school year to ensure that they are placed in rigorous courses that align with their career goals. Parents are encouraged to meet with counselors during the school year to review their student's academic status. In addition, we will provide parent workshops during the school year.

Senior Information

Counselors will meet one on one with each senior during the months of September and October to review the graduation requirements, SOL scores, and post secondary plans. Copies of the student's graduation status and the senior conference report will be mailed home to parents at the end of October. Parents are encouraged to maintain contact with the counselors throughout the school year.

Freshman Information

Counselors will conduct a meet and greet session with their students September 27-30. During this time, students will meet their counselors, identify a career pathway, discuss new graduation requirements, and review study habits as well as extra-curricular activities and after school tutorials. Students will also have the opportunity to ask any questions or concerns that they may have about high school.

Sophomore Information

Counselors will meet with their students October 25-31. During this time, students will review graduation requirements, and set goals for first semester as well as review extra-curricular activities and after school tutorials.

Junior Information

Counselors will meet with their students January 5-6 and January 9-10. During this time, students will review PSAT scores, interpret those results, discuss registration process for SAT and/or ACT, and review graduation requirements and postsecondary options.

PSAT

The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will be administered on Wednesday, October 12, 2011. Additional information will be provided to students and parents during the month of September. Newport News Public Schools will pay for Juniors to take this very important test. There is a minimal fee for underclassmen.

College Fair

Each school year students on the Peninsula and other school divisions have the opportunity to

meet with admission representatives from more than 100 colleges, universities, technical and other post-secondary schools from across the nation. This year the College Fair will be held on Wednesday, October 26, 2011 at the Hampton Roads Convention Center from 5:30 PM- 7:30 PM. All high school students and their parents are encouraged to attend. Many colleges offer fee waivers for those seniors who attend.

College Night in Virginia

Warwick High School will once again host the 2011 College Night in Virginia on November 7, 2011 from 6:00 PM-8:30 PM. A panel of experts will discuss the college admissions process, financial aid and scholarships. Pizza will be served prior to the event and there will be a drawing at the end of the evening for four \$500 scholarships.

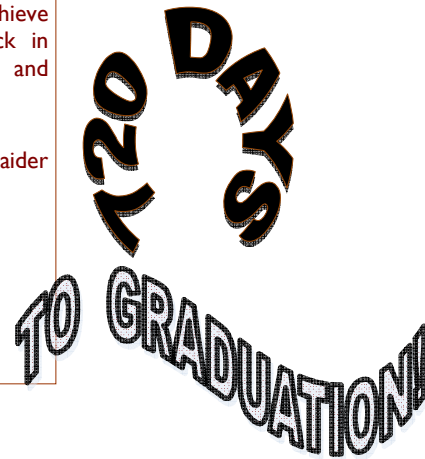
